Vienna Sa, Vice-President



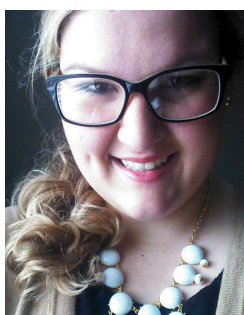
